




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«Sustainable development»

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Workshop on sustainable development

Session 1 - duration: 2h/2h30

Duration	Title	Objectives
10'	Brainstorming	-invite participants to define the concept of sustainable development
30'	A finite planet ("agree/disagree") T-Kit 13 - Sustainability and youth work 85aff3ee-5d5d-7c93-27ba-a0d14d80b83c (coe.int) EN : p26/28	-reflect on the relationship between current views on the economy and the issue of sustainability -learn to argue one's point of view -being able to question one's choices and positions
5'	Video "Sustainable development EN : BIC: Two minutes to understand sustainable development (youtube.com)	-inform participants about the fundamentals of sustainable development and the issues involved
30'-45'	NEEDS AND WANTS T-Kit 13 - Sustainability and youth work EN : p68/p70	-Clarify the concepts of needs and wants and their importance for the sustainability of the planet.
5'	Video "The SDGs Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Explained in 10 minutes or less (youtube.com)	-Provide information on the 17 SDGs and their areas of action to meet the challenges at hand
30'-45'	TAKE A STEP FORWARD T-Kit 13 - Sustainability and youth work EN : p88/90	-Raise awareness of the effects of environmental degradation, and climate change in particular, on people's living conditions; -Raising awareness of the link between unsustainable practices in developed countries and social and environmental injustice around the world; -Encouraging empathy and solidarity with vulnerable people.
15'	Debriefing and evaluation of the session	Find out what participants have learned and how they feel about it



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Session 2 - duration: 2h/2h30

Duration	Title	Objectives
10'	Do you remember?	-Ask participants to introduce sustainable development to a new participant (this helps to see what has been retained from session 1).
30'	An eco-responsible event (stage 1)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">a) ask participants to list the elements to be taken into account when promoting sustainable development at an eventb) ask them to group the elements by pillar (economic, social and environmental)c) ask them to select the SDGs corresponding to the elements classifiedd) present the 12 themes to consider for a successful eco-responsible event
10'	SMART objectives (stage 1)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-ask participants to characterise an objective-ask participants to specify what makes an objective relevant, measurable and realistic
3'	Video "Setting SMART objectives FR: Fixer des objectifs (youtube.com) EN: What are SMART objectives? (youtube.com)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Inform participants about the fundamentals of a SMART objective and the method for writing it down.
10'-	SMART objectives (stage 2)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Give participants a sheet of paper with the initials SMART and ask them to define each initial and explain what they mean.-group discussion and clarification
50'	SMART objectives (stage 3)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-Ask participants to set SMART objectives for the next event to present the communication campaign.-Participants will have to integrate sustainable development and the SDGs into the drafting of their objectives.
15'	Debriefing and evaluation of the session	Find out what participants have learned and how they feel about it
